



QUU to invest more than \$300m in utilities

QUEENSLAND Urban Utilities says it will invest more than \$300 million in water and sewerage services next financial year to meet the evolving needs of its growing customer base.

QUU chief executive officer Louise Dudley said the \$302 million capital investment budget included projects across Brisbane, Ipswich, Lockyer Valley, Scenic Rim and Somerset.

Major projects in 2013/14 include:

Ipswich - Rosewood Sewer Catchment Augmentation (2013/14 spend: \$5.1 million; total project cost: \$10.4 million).

Somerset - Somerset Dam Sewage Treatment Plant (2013/14 spend: \$2.1 million; total project cost: \$2.6 million).

Lockyer Valley - Water Supply Contingency Improvement Program (2013/14 spend: \$2.4 million; total project cost: \$3 million).

QUU will also be improving the reliability of the reservoir network and water tanker filling stations. The program is scheduled to start this month.
